

### HEIRS OF THE KINGDOM

God's revelation of the God-head to humanity unfolds as the Creator, the Redeemer, and the Sanctifier. Following the incarnation at Christmas, our redemption at the Cross and Easter, and the outpouring of the Spirit at Pentecost, the Christian community now celebrates the three persons in the God-head. Our celebration today thus highlights the triune nature of God as Father, Son, and Spirit (Matt 28:19).

Moses in our first reading (Deut 3:32-40) reflects on who this God is, not just for him for his nation. Moses draws his inspiration from the people' experiences of God through God's interaction with them. Moses' teaching comes in a question format; questions that call for deep reflection. Moses appeals to the people's experiences of God's presence in Egypt and during their sojourn in the wilderness: God manifested God's presence in Egypt through the various plagues, and at the foot of the mountain God spoke to them from the heart of the fire. In highlighting these experiences of the people of God Moses draws their attention first to the greatness of God, the God who calls them to be God's own people; but more importantly the God who desires not just a relationship with God's people but intimacy. This implies the greatness of God who condescends to establish a relationship with humans and calls them God's own. Moses addresses further something that is at the heart of the relationship between God and Israel: the Law. Hence, Moses states: "Keep his laws and commandments as I give them to you today so that you and your children may proposer and live long in the land that the Lord your God gives you for ever" (Deut 4:40). Israel is the people of God, and as people of God they are encouraged to abide by the word (the laws and commandments) of God. It is obedience to the word of God that determines their blessings as children of God.

St Paul implies this in our second reading (Rom 8:14-17), when he affirms that "everyone moved by the Spirit" is a child of God (v 14). Whereas Moses emphasises the keeping of the law, Paul places emphasis on the reception of the Spirit which becomes effective from the moment of our baptism (Mark 1:11; Acts 2:38). In Paul's view, the child of God today has the identity and mark as a "recipient of the Spirit". But much more important than the reception of the Spirit is the "living according to the prompting" of the Spirit of God. Paul refers to this as being moved by the Spirit— "Everyone moved by the Spirit is a child of God," says Paul (Rom 8:14). When moved by the Spirit we are able to address God as "Abba", the same intimate term used by Jesus to address God as father (Rom 8:15; cf. Mark14:36). We become "heirs of God and co-heirs with Christ," conferred with all the rights and privileges of God's children (Rom 8:17). It is the Spirit who implants in us that sense of intimacy. Just as Israel was admonished to keep the laws of God so also Paul exhorts us to live a life "moved by the Spirit".

What does it even mean to be moved by the Spirit? It is to be guided by the Spirit in our daily life; to be under the influence of the Spirit. This passionate and enthusiastic appeal from the apostle Paul encourages us, as children of God, to yield to the leading of the Spirit of God, who teaches and reminds us of what Jesus taught (John 14:17). To be moved/led by the Spirit is to abide by the teaching and the counsel of the Spirit, who though invisible, is our unseen friend. To be moved by the Spirit is to be inspired and guided of the Holy Spirit. It suggests a life of obedience to God. Being led by the Spirit renews and reinvigorates our faith, and thus strengthens communion with God. It is this communion (in the Spirit) that gives us the confidence to cry out: "Abba Father!" thus, calling God "daddy".

May the blessing of the Father, Son and the Holy Spirit abide with us now and forever. Amen!

PARISH FINANCE REPORT One of the queries coming out of the recent finance report to parishioners concerns the increase in our annual insurance premium and why has this occurred. Catholic Church Insurances, which had been the insurance provider for parish's in the diocese for many years, was unable to meet it's prudential requirements with the Regulator and, as a consequence, it's board decided that the company would discontinue it's services. This impacted every diocese and catholic entity within Australia. Following a lengthy search for another provider the Sale Diocese, along with most other Catholic Diocese's in Australia, engaged the services of AON Insurance Broker. It became apparent during the negotiation process with AON that Catholic entities were not paying a market rate for their insurance. Prior years premium amounts were not reflecting the increases that were seen in the general insurance market, especially for building and contents and public liability insurance. It also became obvious that parish's were not all paying the same rate of asset value, ranging from as low as \$1.10 to \$2.50 per \$1,000 of asset value. The rate per \$1,000 of asset value all parish's in the diocese are now paying is \$3.98. Hence the significant increase in this year's premium.


