# First Sunday of Lent, Year C 8 - 9 March 2025

My dear Parishioners,

How beautiful it is to have begun the holy season of Lent with the celebration of Ash Wednesday. In 40+ days time we will enter into the Holiest of weeks in celebration of the Paschal festivities. Until then may we utilise the opportunities we have to prepare well by participating actively in the Lenten devotionals and observances. For us here in the Cathedral parish these include, but not limited to, the following:

**Stations of the Cross**: We have already begun this on the Friday following Ash Wednesday. It will continue every **Friday at 6.00pm** in the Cathedral. I encourage everyone to please create time for this prayer of the church and devotion which affords us the opportunity to reflect on the passion of the Lord through meditating on fourteen aspects of the pathway leading up to the crucifixion and burial of Jesus, in anticipation of the rising from the grave. Looking to seeing as many of us as possible every Friday.

Lenten reflections: This year, we thought we might include a brief reflection on our Lenten practices and texts following the Stations of the Cross. It is meant to be a brief reflection and we promise to keep it short and sweet.

**Daily Masses**: As you all know, Lent is a time of deepened prayer life. The highest prayer of the church is the Holy Mass. I'm sure you all know but I'd like to remind us, in the spirit of Lent, and to encourage us to please **TRY AND ATTEND daily Masses** if time/schedule permits. It is always brief, only 30 mins. We begin at 9.30am and by 10.00am it is over. When you're not working could you please give it a go; or make it a particular Lenten observance for yourself.

Adoration: Adoration takes place in the Cathedral on Fridays at 10.00am followed by Mass at 11.00am. It is another beautiful way to engage with the Lord.

**Reconciliation:** We are supposed to stay connected to the Lord every single day. However, Lent is a time when we seek particular reconciliation with the Lord and with one another by attending Confessions. This opportunity is offered **every Friday during adoration in the Cathedral**. In the other churches, please let the priest know before Mass each Sunday when he comes around. You can also ask for this sacrament anytime and whenever you're prepared. Call the parish office, talk to any of the sacristans on duty, or talk to the priest directly and make an appointment. **There will be a special reconciliation service closer to Holy Week**.

**Personal prayers**: The Cathedral is open daily from after Mass till **about 5.00pm**. You can choose to come in for your personal Stations of the Cross or a visit the Lord in the Blessed Sacrament and enjoy the peace of the Lord's presence. Family prayer times will be beautiful during this season.

**Project Compassion**: The envelopes and boxes for this project have been placed in our churches. Our generous donations always go a long way to helping the less privileged near and far.

Thank you for all you have been for the parish. Without you there is no St Mary's Cathedral Parish. May we continue to be united in building our community and parish. God bless you all.

They will be at 6.00pm in the Cathedral each Friday in Lent-14, 21, 28 March and 4 & 11 April. They will be followed each time by a brief Lenten Reflection and Blessing. All are very welcome.

THE 2025 DIOCESAN ASSEMBLY - "Hearts filled with joy, confidence and immense gratitude". On Friday 14th and Saturday 15th of February, 220 representatives from across the whole Diocese gathered at the Federation University Auditorium, Churchill. The two-day program engaged everyone in prayerful listening and spiritual conversations that acknowledged and affirmed the strengths and best practices of the Diocese, identified the significant challenges being faced, and discerned which pastoral priorities needed to be given priority to leverage the movement toward the Diocese becoming a more Christ-centred, synodal and missionary Church. The fruits of the two days were evident in the strong sense of communion, grace, positivity, and renewed hope expressed by the delegates. "My heart is filled with joy, confidence and immense gratitude". "A wonderful two days filled with richness, faith and friendship beyond my expectations". "The experience has given me hope that we will be moving in a direction to secure the future of the Church." "Let's walk in unity as a Diocese and bring these priorities to life through considered action." At the closing Mass, Bishop Greg urged delegates to carry forward the spirit of the Assembly, stating, "We have stood on holy ground; now it is time to put our shoes back on and go forth as pilgrims of hope to others." Bishop Greg, and the members of the Diocesan Mission Council now have the task of drafting a Diocesan Pastoral Plan based on the pastoral priorities identified at the assembly.


# **GOSPEL:**

Filled with the Holy Spirit, Jesus left the Jordan and was led by the Spirit through the wilderness, being tempted there by the devil for forty days. During that time he ate nothing and at the end he was hungry. Then the devil said to him, 'If you are the Son of God, tell this stone to turn into a loaf.' But Jesus replied, 'Scripture says: Man does not live on bread alone.' Then leading him to a height, the devil showed him in a moment of time all the kingdoms of the world and said to him, 'I will give you all this power and the glory of these kingdoms, for it has been committed to me and I give it to anyone I choose. Worship me, then, and it shall all be yours.' But Jesus answered him, 'Scripture says: You must worship the Lord your God, and serve him alone.'

Then he led him to Jerusalem and made him stand on the parapet of the Temple. 'If you are the Son of God', he said to him 'throw yourself down from here, for scripture says: He will put his angels in charge of you to guard you, and again: They will hold you up on their hands in case you hurt your foot against a stone.'

But Jesus answered him, 'It has been said: You must not put the Lord your God to the test.' Having exhausted all these ways of tempting him, the devil left him, to return at the appointed time.
